

# Summer Art Camps at Cedar Ridge Ranch



Week long art day camps that run Mon.-Fri. 1:00 pm – 5:00pm and designed for ages 7-9, 10-12 or 13-15. Drop off is in the Education building as early as 12:30pm, pick up is in the Education building as late as 5:30pm. All camps include a nutritious mid-afternoon snack and an art kit they may take home with them at the end of the week. 8 camper minimum and 20 camper maximum per week.

## Camps for ages 7-9:

### *Storybook Characters*

**June 18-22, 2007** \$190 plus \$25 art kit

This camp is for children who like to create comic book heroes, story-book characters or just have great imaginations! Using nature as their inspiration, the campers will be creating, illustrating and/or building storybook characters by observing their favourite petting zoo animals, garden plants or critters in the wild. This camp will explore the use of watercolour and acrylic paints, shadowbox making, found object collage, assemblage and small-scale sculpture.

### *Drawing and Painting in Nature*

**July 23-27, 2007** \$190 plus \$25 art kit

If your child loves to draw and paint, this camp is for them! The week consists of daily nature walks with stops along the way to draw and to paint their new discoveries. The campers will explore the use of watercolour and acrylic paints, prismacolor pencil, graphite and pastels on a variety of surfaces from paper to canvas.

## Camps for ages 10-12:

### *Multi-Media Storybook*

**August 6-10 2007** \$190 plus \$25 art kit

This is a unique camp experience! Using their imaginations, the campers will be creating and illustrating their own storybook inspired by nature. They will also have an opportunity to record and produce sound effects and narrate their stories using sound production technology. By the end of the week, each camper will go home with an original hand-made, fully illustrated book accompanied by an individually produced soundtrack on audio CD.

### *Drawing and Painting in Nature*

**July 23-27, 2007** \$190 plus \$25 art kit

If your child loves to draw and paint, this camp is for them! The week consists of daily nature walks with stops along the way to draw and to paint their new discoveries. The campers will explore the use of watercolour paints, prismacolor pencil, graphite, acrylic and pastels on a variety of surfaces from paper to canvas.

## Camps for ages 12-15:

### ***Multi-Media Art Journals: The Art of Books and Sound***

**August 13-17, 2007** \$190 plus \$25 art kit

This camp provides a unique opportunity to combine the audio, visual and literary arts through observing the natural world. Not only will the campers be creating artwork using a variety of materials from paint to found objects, they will have an opportunity to record and mix sounds collages using sound recording technology. The camper will end his/her week with a hand-made book and compilation of mixed-media entries that record observations in nature through pictures, words and sounds.
